LAST DAY TO REGISTER FOR GENERAL ELECTION	October 6
EARLY VOTING	October 20-31
GENERAL ELECTION	November 4

Photo ID Required

It's the law in Texas. Voters must present an approved photo ID to vote in person. Choose one of the following:

- 1) Texas driver license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- 2) Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
- 3) Texas concealed handgun license issued by DPS
- 4) U.S. military identification card containing your photograph
- 5) U.S. citizenship certificate containing your photograph
- 6) U.S. passport
- 7) Free Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS

With the exception of the U.S. citizenship certificate, the photo ID must be current or expired no more than 60 days.
